Epiphany: A Season of Lights

The season of Epiphany begins after the twelfth day of Christmas, January 6. It is the day and season that we celebrate the in-breaking of God's light. Throughout the season of Epiphany, we will hear many wonderful stories of the start of Jesus' life and ministry.

Epiphany is called Three Kings Day in some places of the world, to commemorate the Magi's visit with gifts. In some places, such as Latin American countries, more gifts are exchanged on Epiphany than Christmas Day itself. In other places, such as Ireland, it is called "Women's Christmas." This is the day that women hold parties or socialize with other female friends and relatives, getting a day off from the traditional female household duties.



Many popular customs take place on Epiphany: blessing one's house, eating a Three Kings Cake, or removing Christmas decorations. Chalking the door is another tradition at Epiphany, one in which we will take part at Christ Lutheran. The doors are marked with the year, with C, M, and B in between. This year it will show 20 + C + M + B + 25. The letters C, M, and B can represent two things: the traditional name of the Magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar) or the Latin blessing Christus mansionem benedicat, meaning "May Christ bless this house." Join us after worship on Sunday, January 5 to chalk the doors and bless our sanctuary for another year.




Worship Time Change


