Godly Play: Spiritual Growth for more than just kids

Our Sunday School program at Christ Lutheran Church is called Godly Play. It is a Montessori method for Christian education and has been utilized in churches around the world. Created by the Rev. Dr. Jerome Berryman in the 1970s, the Godly Play method is about understanding how the stories of God's people connect with our own experience and relationship with God. Godly Play was designed to introduce Christian language, stories and ideas to children.

Additionally, the Godly Play program supports the teachers' developing faith relationship with Christ. They are free to focus on spiritual preparation and relationship-building between teachers, children, Christ, and families.



Ways That You Can Help with Godly Play:

Door Person

The door person plays a critical role in the program, but the job is not difficult. The door person does no work outside of class. He or she helps to organize the room and waits for the students to arrive. As each child enters the classroom, they greet the child, and ask them to take a deep breath and prepare themselves for the lesson.



Following the story, the door person listens as each child tells the teacher what work would help them best respond to the story, and facilitates distribution of materials (such as clay, paper, story pieces, etc.) After cleanup and the feast, the door person assists children with reconnecting with their parents.

If you're interested in Godly Play, I would highly encourage you to attend an official Godly Play

training. There are introductory workshops, as well as doorperson workshops available virtually in October, November, and December. Check the Godly Play Foundation website (godlyplayfoundation.org) to learn more.

If you can't attend a training, read Jerome Berryman's book, Teaching Godly Play or The Complete Guide to Godly Play: Volume 1. It explores these ideas in depth and answers many questions about how Godly Play works. It's a short read and I would be happy to lend you my books.

Please contact myself or Deacon Laura to answer your questions, tour the classroom, and give you further resources.
