The Benefit of Gratitude

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

To speak of gratitude in November feels almost cliché or automatic somehow. However, gratitude is actually a powerfully transformative tool that can be used anytime. Diana Butler Bass writes in her book, *Grateful*, that gratitude is more than an emotion, it's a disposition to be cultivated. So then practicing gratitude can be of benefit to us.

Our family went through a significant health crisis two summers ago. It was not easy to feel grateful during this difficult time, but we grew through it. Frequent hospital trips? Yes. Yet we had reliable cars. Uncertain outcomes? To be sure. Yet the health care professionals were caring and skilled. Unanticipated expenses? Yes. Yet with patience, God's provision took care of those as well. Perhaps there is something in every moment—no matter how difficult—for which thanks can be given.

Practicing Gratitude submitted by Jenny Campbell

If you must look back, do so forgivingly. If you must look forward, do so prayerfully. However, the wisest thing you can do is be present in the present — gratefully. — Maya Angelou

Choose something from the list below and try it during November. If it works for you, maybe you will find that you would like to continue it beyond this month! Remember that gratitude is a choice that takes time to incorporate, so whatever you decide to do, plan to do it at regular times. Diana Butler Bass says that gratitude compounds like interest, so let's start investing today!

- Read a book on gratitude: Grateful by Diana Butler Bass, Spiritual Practices for the Brain by Anne Kertz Kernion, or others
- Keep a gratitude journal
- Give thanks daily for five things
- Seek out prayers of gratitude from Psalms or a devotional
- Use your five senses to appreciate the miracle of being alive savor your food, breathe in fresh air, slow down and look around you
- Set up visual reminders to be grateful pictures of loved ones, gratitude quotes
- Smile, look people in the eye, and say thank you to any and all who assist you in any way
- Create a gratitude jar write notes of gratitude and read them during family time
- Take time to send thank you notes, emails, and texts to people
- In awkward or difficult moments, consider how to reframe it and find something for which you can give thanks
- Give thanks before meals, and/or at the start or end of the day

(Many of these ideas are from Spiritual Practices for the Brain.)

Year-to-date Budget Expenses:	\$ 341,298
Year-to-date Actual Expenses:	\$ 330,811
Amount under Budget:	+\$ 10,487
Net YTD Surplus	+\$ 46,496

Please note that \$33,840 of this surplus is the result of reducing our Synod Mission Support from 15% to 6%. The balance of the surplus, \$12,656, is the result of some of our members already making their total pledge and our staff's frugal efforts in controlling expenses.
