
Pressing Pause

The season of Lent echoes the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the desert before the start of his public ministry. It begins on Ash Wednesday, as we are reminded of our mortality. The season ends on the first of three days leading up to the Easter Vigil, where we hear the wonderful acclamation of Jesus' resurrection.

There are noticeable shifts in our life together as a community of faith during Lent. Sunday worship will begin with confession and forgiveness, followed by the ministers processing to the front in silence. We will not use the word "Alleluia" and the baptismal font will remain empty. Our Wednesday night schedule will shift slightly to allow time for fellowship over soup suppers, education, and an evening vespers service.

Each year this season invites us to press pause and reflect. For some, it is a season to fast from something, like chocolate or dessert, rich foods or alcohol. Some may try to break bad habits like spending too much time on social media or electronic devices, or not moving our bodies enough throughout the day or week.

For others, it is the opportunity to expand on spiritual practices. People may aim to pray or read scripture daily, spend time in silence or stillness, or perhaps journal regularly. Whatever changes you make — whether it is taking away or fasting from something or adding something to your habits and routine — I invite you to enter Lent with a renewed sense of connecting with the divine. As we journey towards the cross, may we strive to reflect on the many gifts in our lives and give thanks for God's continued guidance, especially in the season of pastoral transition. Thanks be to God!

A Fond Farewell from Dagny Brandt (edited for length)

Music Ministry has been an integral part of my life – it completes me. My first memory of worship music was sitting in the front row in a rural North Dakota church when I was 3. I would "sing" the hymns and liturgy at the appointed times as dad preached and mom played the organ. For the past 60 some years my church music roles have varied, but church music and music ministry are deeply woven into the fabric of who I am. I have been keenly aware of the responsibility to share my God-given musical gifts.

After much prayer and discussion with family and colleagues, I have decided that the time has come for me to retire from a majority of my commitments both at Christ Lutheran Church and Highland Community College. Please accept this letter as formal notice of my retirement from my position of Spirit Singers Director effective at the end of the choir season (May 2025).

It has been a privilege to direct the CLC Spirit Singers for the past four years and share in music ministry with Jennifer, Chris, and Craig. I have worked in many church settings, and this is a wonderful place to wrap up my career. The staff at Christ Lutheran sets a high bar for excellence, caring, support and service. Jennifer has been a blessing to me. From day one I felt welcomed and part of the team. I am thankful for her creative genius, vast knowledge of church music, friendship and support of me and my work. Chris and I have worked together even longer, and I will hold dear the many wonderful worship moments that we have shared. I will genuinely miss everyone here. It has been a privilege to direct the Spirit Singers and get to know this dedicated group. They also welcomed me with open arms and have worked so hard to share God's love and promises through music at CLC and out in the world.

It is hard to believe that I am finishing my 40th year of teaching and music ministry, and that the time has come to retire. However, health and family changes (I'm going to be a grandma in February!) have helped me come to this decision. Again, I am grateful to all of you for allowing me to end my career on a high note at CLC! I will remember with joy and fondness the many worship and fellowship experiences I have shared with the Spirit Singers, the CLC staff and congregation. I will continue to pray for the music ministry at Christ Lutheran Church as we all continue to go out to sing His praises and share His love.
