


The Great Three Days

Each year, as we close the end of the Lenten season, we journey through the great Three Days. The *Triduum* refers to the three days of Holy Week which focus on Christ's passage from death to life—Maundy Thursday through the Easter Vigil. The worship services are meant to flow from one day to the next.

First of the Three Days is Maundy Thursday. Washing of feet, a sign of Jesus' servanthood, is offered as a reminder of the servant call for every follower of Jesus. We gather around the table to recall the last supper Jesus shared with his disciples before his arrest. The service concludes with a stripping of the altar, which is symbolic of Jesus' humiliation by his Roman captors. Candles are extinguished; sacramental elements and vessels removed; linens, paraments, and all other furnishes are carried out of the worship space. We depart the empty sanctuary in silence.

Good Friday begins in silence. This worship service includes some of the most ancient traditions of Christian worship, such as the bidding prayer. We hear the story of Jesus' passion and respond in song. Sometimes candles are extinguished after each reading, darkening the space as the time of Jesus' death grows closer. The bidding prayer includes time for silent prayer by the congregation. The solemn reproaches, which date back to at least the 9th century, begin with Christ expressing a specific act or sacrifice he has made for humanity, followed by a question or



lament about why he has been repaid with betrayal. The service ends in a darkened sanctuary as we depart once again in silence.

The Easter Vigil begins with a new fire lit on the prayer labyrinth. We bless the new Paschal candle and process into the church building. Individual candles are lit from the Paschal candle. We hear several readings, followed by time for reflection and prayer. During the adornment of the nave (what we lovingly call "Holy Chaos" here at CLC), all are welcome to help adorn the worship space with the things that were removed just two nights earlier. Fresh flowers are also brought in. The rest of the service looks very similar to a Sunday morning service. We give thanks for the gift of baptism, hear the prayers of intercession, share the peace with one another, and gather once again around the table for Holy Communion.

The Three Days are a special time of year. If you have not experienced all three services, I highly recommend you try them this year. Easter's power and joy has become so much greater for me since I started attending all three services of the *Triduum*.

Women's Spring Retreat April 26


