Refreshment for a New Season

Towards the end of July, I made my way once again to the Bon Secours Retreat Center in Marriottsville, Maryland for the final residency of the Going Deeper program. Each day was spent with silent prayer and learning a new contemplative practice. We had morning and afternoon sessions with guest speakers, as well as daily peer group meetings where we processed the day's learning. We worshipped together to end each day.

The final residency seemed to fly by. Contemplative practices that seemed difficult during our first residency seem to be welcomed, sometimes craved, by my spirit. I left feeling refreshed and ready to return to ministry at CLC. My program, however, is not officially complete until October 15.

"What's next?" you may ask. I am still working on finishing the reading list from the program. Some of the materials will make their way into the Wayposts emails and posting. I will also need to do a final project.

One of the required readings of this program was Susan Beaumont's How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going. As I listened to the audiobook, I found myself saying, "That sounds like where CLC is right now!"



I have decided to create a curriculum for congregations navigating the season of transition. I will be presenting this curriculum during the first six adult forum sessions this fall, beginning September 15. I invite you to attend, even if you don't normally, in order to help with this final project. There really are not adequate words to describe the care, love and support that this family of faith has shown our little family of six. It is amazing to be part of a community who accepts us completely in all of our brokenness and our challenges as well as all of our joys. On August 9, we were able to finalize the legal adoption of three children.

When Jason and I walked through the doors as a couple 13 years ago, we knew we had found a special place. Then a little over six years later we became a family of three and were wrapped in support and encouragement.

Three months into parenthood we were both hit with food poisoning. I needed my little one taken to daycare because we were in no shape to take him or give him the best care at the time. I called someone from church who lived nearby and who I served with on the Global Mission Team. She agreed to pick him up and take him to daycare. When she arrived she asked who was bringing him home later. Naively, I said that I was confident I would be well enough to pick him up. The response was that she hoped I felt much better but she would be happy to pick him up and bring him home. She arrived later that afternoon with Wyatt, chicken soup and banana bread.

Five years ago when we doubled in size overnight becoming six, you immediately wanted to know how you could support us. Meals came several times a week. The older kids asked why people were bringing us dinner. In a time of such uncertainty for these kids who had their lives turned upside down, hearing me tell them the food came because people cared for us and wanted to help showed the kids much needed encouragement and support.

I tell everyone who comments on the lives that Jason and I have built over the last 15 years together that it is all His plan and all of your prayers. I am a little biased, but our story of becoming a couple to a family of three to a family of six is an amazing one of faith, love and prayer. Christ Lutheran is definitely a prime example of where faith makes family! Thanks be to God and thank you!
